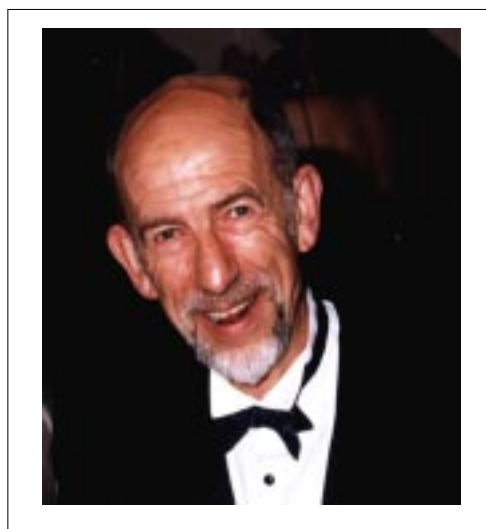

National ICT Educator of the Year 2002

is Mr Harry Clements-Shepherd (pictured) this prestigious peer award is given by ACS and ACCE.

Mr Clements-Shepherd was also awarded the accolade of Information Technology Educator of the Year (WA) by The Educational Computing Association of WA (inc) in October 2001. These awards recognise over 15 years of service to educators and education in Australia as well as internationally.

Mr Clements-Shepherd was notified this week that he has now been recognised as the *National* Information & Communication Technology Educator Of The Year by the Australian Computer Society as well as the Australian Council for Computers in Education.



It is also of note that in the recent Curriculum Council awards for excellence in 2001, of the six Certificates of Distinction awarded for Interactive Media, (students being in the top 0.5% in WA) three of these were taught by Mr Clements-Shepherd at CBC Fremantle.

Mr Clements-Shepherd recently represented Australia as a workshop presenter at the World Conference for Computers in Education held in Copenhagen, Denmark. He is also an international consultant for the Global Knowledge Exchange in New Jersey, America. With an interesting early career that includes leaving school as a 15yo, becoming a jackaroo, horsebreaker and later a livestock auctioneer, before 'settling down' to making self improvement a way of life, he can readily promote the values of 'lifelong learning' to the students with whom he has regular contact.
